R E S O L U T I O N

Under Government Resolution, former Education and Labour Department No. SSN-3470-41845-G, dated the 21st December, 1971 as amended from time to time, the Government have introduced a pension scheme for teaching and non-teaching staff in the grant-in-aid or otherwise, non-Govt. Secondary Schools in the State of Gujarat, under certain terms and conditions as mentioned therein. Para-7 of the aforesaid Govt. Resolution provides for counting the length of qualifying service for pension and condonation of breaks in service. These orders inter-alia lay down that subject to the general conditions, six breaks are admissible for condonation of which four breaks are on account of resignation of service. It further provides that the total period of six breaks should not exceed two years and in any case any one break at a given time should not exceed 15 months duration.

2. The Government have also issued orders Govt. Resolution No. NGC-1582-9505(84)-KH, dated the 15th October, 1984 regarding pension scheme for the teaching staff in the Non Govt. affiliated colleges and in the Universities. These orders, however, do not provide for condonation of breaks as in the case of non-Govt. secondary schools teachers. It has been represented to Govt. by the non-Government secondary Teacher Federation that the existing provisions of the pension scheme as applicable to them causes hardship and is discriminatory from the one available to the staff of the colleges and in the Universities. It has, therefore, been demanded that the pension scheme for non-Govt. Secondary School employees should also provide similarly as in the case of college and University teachers.

3. Government has carefully considered the request of the Federation and has decided that both the schemes should be put on the same footing. Inpartial modification, therefore, on para-7 of the Govt. Resolution dated the 21st December, 1971 referred to above, Government is pleased to direct that in computing the length of qualifying service for pension under this scheme, all previous service whether temporary, officiating or permanent in any institution where such service is treated as a qualifying service shall be taken into account. The period of break in such service will not be considered as qualifying service, i.e. actual service rendered in such institutions will be considered a qualifying service for purposes of pension under this scheme.
